1.	Welcome and Opening Remarks	The President welcomed the members to the meeting. The President noted that the Board had met prior to the AGM and that they discussed great topics of interest such as ICCS strategic plan and marketing plan.
2.	Notice of Annual General Meeting	The notice of the Annual General Meeting was circulated to the Joint Councils members on July 11, 2018 and material was also posted in advance of the meeting.
3.	Review of Previous Minutes September October 3, 2017 and AGM agenda of September 25, 2018	 The President asked if there were any comments on the minutes of the October 3rd, 2017 meeting and there were none. MOTION # 1: Silvano Tocchi moved the adoption of the October 3, 2017 minutes. Natasha Clarke seconded the motion. All in favour. The President asked if there were any changes to the agenda and there were none. MOTION # 2: Anik Dupont moved the adoption of the September 25, 2018 agenda. Ron Hinshaw seconded the motion. All in favour.
4.	ICCS Financials a) ICCS Audited Financial Statements as of March 31, 2018.	Jeffrey Weigensberg from RZN, LLP provided his comments on the financial statements. He advised that there were no issues that arose during the audit and he commented the ICCS for being transparent on all transactions and providing supporting documentation. MOTION # 4: Paul Pierlot moved the adoption of the appointment of RZN, LLP, Chartered Accountants to continue to act as the auditor for the Institute for Citizen-Centred Service and prepare the financial statements for the fiscal year ending March 31, 2019. Silvano Tocchi seconded the motion. All in favour.
