			 with the use of digital currency? For individuals? For businesses? Will identity requirements be introduced based on regulations in regard to transaction amounts or aggregate dollar amounts per day/month? What devices, systems or services will people be expected to have in order to make use of a digital currency? Will there be user cohorts that may not have these things? If so, what options will they have? Is there expectation that payment of fees and taxes to government and for government services will need to accept the digital currency? The current burden associated with Payment Card Industry Compliance is hard to bear.

			Would the digital currencies be held in 'universal' digital wallets? The S2B WG is looking at establishing digital wallets that would hold digital credentials such as licences, permits as well as identity. It would make sense to have universal wallets (similar to how we hold these documents and currencies in physical wallets)		
			 Are they looking to enable the use of digital currencies anonymously or are they looking to add tracing-auditing or both? Do they see a role for digital identity for tracing or auditing purposes? This is a public policy question and depending upon the position, there would be implications for how its implemented. 		
			 Would the digital currency exist in parallel with physical currency? There would be implications to ensure universal access. 		
			 Are they looking at enabling off-line use of the digital currencies (where there is no internet)? 		
			 How are they looking to address issues such as 'lost' digital wallets or situations where the holder is unable to access their wallet? Other items around the death of the holder and how the value is transferred to beneficiaries?
