Located in historic Charlottetown. In 1964 each province and the federal government committed 15 cents on behalf of each citizen of Canada to raise a total of \$5.6 million needed to construct **Canada's National Memorial to the Fathers of Confederation** – those visionaries who gathered at Providence House in 1864 to discuss the creation of our country. Covering an entire city block, the Centre stands on Queen's Square, which was once the site of the Charlottetown marketplace. The Centre houses several theatres, a National Art Gallery, a restaurant, and a gift shop. Open year-round, it showcases the best in Canadian visual and performing arts; it is the home of Anne of Green Gables – The Musical.
