The new system will also incorporate the Office's intent to adopt the CRA (Canada Revenue Agency) Business Number.</p>

With the increased capacity of the Education network, students and teachers have greater access to online digital teaching resources and tools. This project provided all schools with equivalent standard technology and wireless access.</p>
