Founded in 1929, the Royal Canadian Geographical Society was built to showcase Canada's accomplishments on the world stage. The RCGS has been making Canada better known to Canadians and to the world for 94 years. Best known for its Canadian Geographic magazine, the Society also supports Canadian geographical expeditions. The Society's vision is to help Canadians chart a successful future by fostering a greater understanding of Canada's geography — its diverse human and physical landscapes — as well as the changes affecting its people and the environment.

It's only fitting that a hub for exploration and geographic education in Canada should be situated at the confluence of two historic rivers. The Rideau Falls mark where the eponymous river joins the Ottawa River, which forms the border between Canada's two largest provinces — a symbolic connection between English- and French-speaking Canadians. Prior to confederation, the Ottawa River and its tributaries supported Indigenous Peoples and served as important trade routes.
